Humboldt Bay Fire in conjunction with other local agencies including the Eureka Police Department and the Humboldt County Sheriff's Office, will be participating in simulated Criminal Multi-Casualty Incident (CMCI) trainings at Winship Middle School on the following date and time:

Monday, June 24th 9:00AM – 12:00PM

This training focuses on organizational concepts and response priorities for the first several minutes of a multi-agency response to an Active Shooter or other Criminal Multi-Casualty Incident. It is designed to help enhance our local agencies' ability to work collaboratively and quickly if and when we are called to respond.

Law Enforcement will be utilizing mock "blue" guns, and Fire & EMS will be performing rescue and setting up triage areas for mock patients with injuries simulated by theatrical make-up.

We welcome media attendance at this exercise (No public viewing will be permitted).
