

Each member of our team has a heart for serving Humboldt. From our firefighters to our volunteers, know that Humboldt Bay is in great hands.























In 2022, Humboldt Bay Fire (HBF) applied for and received a grant through California Department of Parks and Recreation, Division of Boating and Waterway for the purchase of an Inflatable Rescue Boat (IRB). The goal for this boat is to provide access and rescue capabilities to the Humboldt Bay area within the jurisdiction of HBF as well as providing aid to partnering agencies (i.e State Parks, Coast Guard, HCSO). The grant provided funding

of an IRB from Wing
Inflatables, based in
Arcata, as well as a trailer
and motor, which were
sourced locally through
RMI in Eureka.

Our personnel have worked hard on training to become certified boat operators. We are proud to announce that six of our crew are now fully trained on boating operations and can now better assist with water rescues in the Humboldt Bay.

HBF INJHED7 COMMUNITY


This year HBF took part in events all over the community. Each year we participate on average in 3-5 community events or PR details per month. We are always happy to make a presence whenever we can.






WE'RE THERE FOR OUR NEIGHBORS

WE'RE EXPANDING OUR REACH

HUMBOLDT BAY FIRE CERT

The national Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) program educates volunteers about disaster preparedness for the hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations.

CERT offers a consistent, nationwide approach to volunteer training and organization that professional responders can rely on during disaster situations, allowing them to focus on more complex tasks.

The Humboldt Bay Fire JPA CERT Team, with 24 members works with the HBF Community Risk Reduction Specialist to assist the department year-round.
